#### **Action Taken Report**

Mr. Anil Adagale presented Action Taken Report.

- a. Uploading The GA, PO & PSO which was approved in the last Academic Council Meeting was uploaded on the college website
- b. The Specialization of HRM for B. Com was offered to S.Y.B. Com students for Regular and Honours programme from the academic year 2020-21. 130 students have enrolled for HRM programme.
- c. A new Programme B. Com (Interdisciplinary) was implemented from the academic year 2020-2021. The student enrolment for the said programme is 42 at F.Y.B.Com.
- d. The college had applied to four certificate courses under different Skill Service Sectors under UGC scheme and the same had been approved by UGC. UGC has sanctioned grant of Rs. 1 crore for the same. However, due to pandemic situation and certain conditions laid down by UGC, the courses were not offered to the students in the academic year 2020-21. Grant of has been postponed. The course need to implement in off line mode and it is difficult to call the students on the campus and start the course. If UGC permits and gave us the sanctioned amount of Rs. 1 crore, the College will implement the programme in the next academic year.

Dr. Hilda David explained the Programme Specific Outcome for B.Com. (Interdisciplinary Studies) as follows:

UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED THAT all the proposal to approve new curriculum and revised curricular for new and existing courses to be implemented from the academic year 2021-2022 are approved with incorporating the suggestions as per the list attached in the Annexure I.

Item No. 6 [ACM/2020-2021/1/6]

#### To approve the revised examination pattern w.e.f. 2020-2021.

Dr. Yogini Chiplunkar, Controller of Examination put the proposal to approve the revised examination pattern w.e.f. 2020-2021. She explained that with an objective of doing continuous assessment and evaluation of the students and as recommended by UGC, college has introduced 70+30 Pattern of evaluation for First Year B.A., B.Com. students i.e. 70 internal components and 30 externals. This decision was taken in Examination Committee meeting held on 13.8.2020.

- There shall be total of 100 marks evaluation per subject/course during each semester.
- The total of 100 marks would consist of 3 components as given below:
- (i) Component 1 Internal for 50 marks This would comprise of a combination of minimum 2 or more assignments/activities/book reviews/quiz/competitions/article reviews, presentations etc.
- (ii) Component 2 Internal for 20 marks. This would comprise of a Mid semester examination
- (iii) Component 3 Semester End examination for 30 marks

The College has also made separate passing in each of these components mandatory with minimum 40 marks in each component. Accordingly, a student will have to score: a minimum of 20 Marks out of 50 in internal assessment, a minimum of 8 marks out of 20 from Mid Semester Examination a minimum of 12 marks out of 30 in semester end examination and a total of 40 marks out of 100 in order to pass in each subject. If the student does not pass in any one component, he will be considered as 'fail' and he will be treated as backlog student for that particular component.

# iv. Transnational Course between Hildesheim University and Symbiosis College of Arts and Commerce (SCAC)

#### Admission

Dr. Tessy Thadathil, Vice Principal gave update on admissions and online Teaching for the academic year 2020-2021. She told that even in the pandemic situation of covid, 2659 students were admitted in UG Programme and 329 students were admitted in PG Programme considering the intake of the courses

#### **Online Teaching**

The students are studying through 'Online Teaching' and all the teachers are taking lectures through 'online' accepting the challenge very positively.

#### Execution of examination on account of covid 19 situation

Dr. Yogini Chiplunkar, Controller of Examination briefed about execution of examination on account of covid 19 situation. Due to Covid, the colleges in Maharashtra were closed from 14th March 2020. As per the decision of Government of Maharashtra and Savitribai Phule Pune University, first and second year students of UG and 1st year students of PG were promoted. The examination of Final year UG and PG students and backlog examinations of UG and PG all semesters along with improvement examinations of semester 2 and 4 were conducted between 25th September 2020 to 9th November 2020 through Google classroom. These online examinations were conducted using Open Book examination mode. For this following process was followed:

- Detailed Instructions about all aspects of examinations given to students through website
- Students to appear for OBE through Google classroom
- Teachers prepared 2 sets of question papers (for all applicable patterns)
- Uniform template given by exam section for creating Google classroom
- Google classrooms were created by teachers for OBE and Assignments
- Question papers approved from HODs
- All the google classroom codes were compiled and put it on the website and students joined the classroom
- Teachers prepared Confirmation form and uploaded on classroom, students after joining the class filled the form
- Teachers uploaded question papers in pdf and prepared google form for accepting responses.
- After receiving answer-papers, with the help of admin staff absentees were finalized.
- Softcopy of marks sent to exam section for result preparation.

In the current academic year, the examinations of semester 1,3,5 of UG, semester 3 of PG and backlog examinations (October 2020) of all semesters of UG and PG were conducted using same process between 10th January 2021 to 4th February 2021.

And as currently also College have continued online teaching as per decision of Maharashtra Government and Savitribai Phule Pune University, for April 2021 semester end examinations of UG and PG, same process will be followed. Tentative dates of this examination have been announced and put on the website and these examinations will be conducted between 8th May 2021 to 4th June 2021.

# Transnational Course between Hildesheim University and Symbiosis College of Arts and Commerce (SCAC)

Dr. Tessy Thadathil briefed on Transnational Course between Hildesheim University and Symbiosis College of Arts and Commerce (SCAC).

A joint online learning endeavour was carried out in the winter term of 2019-2020, 2020-21 by Symbiosis College of Arts & Commerce, Pune and the Institute of Information Science and Language Technology at the University of Hildesheim, Germany. The purpose of the learning scenario was to foster intercultural learning and information literacy. Students individually had to learn about foundations of information literacy and basics of specific topics namely

To do this, students had to search, read, summarize and reflect on the state-of-the-art literature and use cases. After accomplishing these basics, mixed groups, consisting of Indian and German students combined their knowledge on each of the specific topics and collaborated to create an artefact that others could use to improve their information literacy. After accomplishing that, students provided feedback to others on their group work. At the end of the learning scenario, students reflected on their learning via a student conference.

It is proposed to award two value addition credits in recognition of the research work carried out by the students.

Item No. 8 [ACM/2020-2021/1/8]

To update about new UGC Guidelines for Higher Education Institutions to offer Apprenticeship/Internship embedded Degree Programme (AEDP):

Dr. Neelofar Raina briefed about the Apprenticeship/Internship embedded degree programme (AEDP) initiative as per UGC guidelines. UGC launched the guidelines for Higher Education institutions to offer AEDP. For this the UGC has announced the budget of 2020-2021. She further informed that This programme will provide skilled and trained manpower to industry. The Practical component in the curriculum and on job training will make our students work ready.

#### Objectives of AEDP:

- To improve the employability of students pursuing U.G. level degree programme.
- To focus on outcome-based learning in degree programme.
- •To promote active linkage between higher education system and industry, commercial/noncommercial organizations

The Symbiosis College of Arts and commerce is keen to initiate AEDP from the academic year 2021-22 at Second Year level. The College had two meetings with Board of Apprenticeship training (Western Region) and have identified two Sector Skill councils i.e Retail and BFSI. The Sector Skill Councils, BOAT and industry partners will be sharing their expertise to effectively implement this embedded programme. This programme will be skill based and course will be designed to make the students more employable and industry Ready. The programme will be started after the approval of the committee members of ACM. Six months training to the students at Second Year level, go to the industry and then they will be absorbed. The MOU will be approved and signed in due course.

Item No. 9 [ACM/2020-2021/1/9]

To explore the possibilities and opportunities of International collaborations based on the new draft guidelines issued by the UGC.

Mr. Anil Adagale explained the new draft guidelines which was issued by the UGC to explore the possibilities and opportunities of International Collaborations. The UGC has invited the suggestions from the stakeholders. As soon as this draft approved, College will implement the same and can have collaboration with foreign institutes. Dr. Tessy Thadathil briefed that this draft relates to an academic collaboration between Indian and Foreign higher education institutions for UG and PG programmes

and not for the online education programme. As per the guidelines, credit conferred by a foreign higher education institution to be recognized, quantified and included towards the credit requirements for a programme delivered by an Indian higher education institution solely or jointly with a foreign higher education institution. There is a provision of 'Twinning arrangement' which shall be a collaborative arrangement whereby students enrolled with an Indian higher education institution may under their programme of study partly in India, complying with relevant UGC regulation and partly in the foreign education institution. The degree or diploma shall be awarded by the Indian institution only. The credits earned by the students at a foreign institution shall be counted for degree /diploma awarded by the Indian institution. The courses are mentioned in the transcript also.

no programme of study shall be offered which is against the national security and territorial integrity of India. The approval of Board of Governors/Board of Management should be obtained for academic collaboration with any foreign higher education institution. The College have to enter into a written Memorandum of Understanding or Agreement. The academic requirements and other details of the programme to be offered shall be made public by displaying on the College website before commencement of programme. She also told about 'dual degree programme', conditions for collaboration, eligibility criteria, procedure, approval mode etc. about the same.

Item No. 10 [ACM/2020-2021/1/10]

#### To approve the post of Teacher Assistant

Dr. Tessy Thadathil, Vice Principal explained the need/requirement of Teacher Assistant. There has been work pressure to the teachers due to autonomy, on-line teaching due to lockdown. She put the proposal to appoint five teacher Assistants, one for Arts, one for Economics and three for Commerce. The teacher assistant should be a post graduate in the concerned discipline (Economics/ English/ Commerce) Should be conversant with computer programs such as MS Word, MS Excel & Power point Should possess soft skills and should be comfortable communicating with both faculty & students. He / She should not be exceeding 35 years. After approval from Symbiosis Management, College will do recruitment.

#### Their nature of duties will be:

- 1. Collaborate with faculty to develop lesson content and instruction methodology
- 2. Communicating with program coordinators to line up classes and rooms 3. Prepare and maintain student records
- 4. Assist in execution of assignments and its evaluation

- 5. Timely generation and submission of markslists and other reports
- 6. Helping plan and publicize workshops, student activities, course orientation, etc
- 7. Data entry as and when required

Consolidated emolument will be Rs. 35,000/- p.m. and the tenure will be of one year.

#### SELECTION PROCEDURE:

Interviews will be conducted for the eligible candidates. However, if a greater number of candidates are found eligible for the post, advertisement, Written Test/Skill Test may also be conducted on the same day before final round of Interview.
