2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student-centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences:

The pandemic has paved the way for exploring technology-based student centric methods to enable participative learning and the use of problem-solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences. Depending upon the subject and its curriculum, teachers used innovative pedagogy to make online teaching more effective. Research project is an integral part of Honors and Post-graduate programs curriculum through which students worked on primary data with application of theoretical concepts. College has taken efforts to enhance learning experiences by providing the students with online co-curricular and extracurricular opportunities. Students were encouraged to actively participate, host and organized programs such as TEDxSCAC, International skill conclave, Entrepreneurship summit, International and National

webinars, student exchange program to Hildesheim University under Erasmus Plus, competitions such as Emerge-research paper competition, Waxing Eloquent-elocution and debate competition, Marathi play reading competition, guest sessions, alumni engagement sessions and workshops. Symbiosis College of Arts and Commerce aims to bring about holistic development of students through inside and out of class enhanced learning experiences.

ICT enabled tools including online resources for effective teaching and learning process. Teaching and learning were entirely done through LMS MS Teams. Online-content and e-resources such as articles pdfs, book pdfs were shared, power-point presentations were used through this platform. MS teams and Google classroom were used for conducting quiz, assignment and examinations. Sharing of study material and e-content was done through Teams and google classroom. Teachers used language apps, e-pathshala, e-Gyankosh, Scribd teaching resources and Swayam platform for additional teaching resource. TED talks, Josh Talks, documentaries, short films, film clips, blogs, and vlogs, You Tube videos were used for experiential learning. E-resources from N-list, JSTOR, CMIE, Economic outlook, RBI, MOSPI were shared with students as reference material. Break out rooms and poll in Teams features were used to conduct activities online. Portals such MCA website, Big blue button, Phonetics, University of IOWA, BBC were used for referring to additional resources. Tally, ERP and Ms Excel was used to teach the subjects Accounts and Costing. Some teachers created their own learning material on YouTube which is shared with students.

2.5.3 - IT integration and reforms in the examination procedures and processes including Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) have brought in considerable improvement in the Examination Management System (EMS) of the Institution

The Academic year of 2020-21 was started in the last week of August 2020. The Regular and Backlog Examinations of UG and PG for October 2020 were held between 4 th January to 4 th February 2021. Open Book Examination pattern was used for these exams and exams were conducted using Google classrooms. College introduced 70-30 pattern to the first year students of BA and BCom. Accordingly, Internal Assessment of 70 Marks per subject was done by the subject teachers and 30 Marks Semester end examination was conducted. The regular semester end and backlog examinations of of UG and PG for April 2021 were held from 8th May 2021. Online Open book examination format was used for these exams. And these exams were conducted using google classroom. Due to covid pandemic there was lockdown in Pune and college admin staff as well as teachers were working from home during the period of examinations. And, it was decided to conduct these online exams from Home. For this a detailed procedure and system incorporating all required checks

and balances was devised. To explain all the details of the process, separate meetings/training sessions of UG & PG faculty, admin staff were conducted.

We are in the process of designing the Course outcomes along the lines of our Programme Outcomes. Each course outcome is mapped to one or multiple Programme Specific Outcomes. The Vision-Mission of the College, the Graduating Attributes (GA), Programme Outcomes (PO) and Programme Specific Outcomes (PSO) are taken as a base to frame the Course Outcomes (CO).

One of the ways to attain the PO and PSOs is to map with the evaluation system. To ensure the continuous assessment of the students, we have a framework of Internal and external assessment. In the academic year, 2020-21 the assessment pattern introduced for the First-year UG students is 70:30. The previous pattern continues for second and third-year students is 40:60. With the introduction of this new pattern of assessment, the weightage of internal assessment has increased from 40% to 70%.

The heterogeneous assessment formats provide an opportunity to attain the Program outcomes and Program Specific Outcomes.

A wide range of curricular, Co-curricular and extra-curricular activities are organized by Departments and Associations and Centers of our college which direct us towards the attainment of our Graduating Outcomes Program outcomes and course outcomes.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning, viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipments, etc.

Each classroom has benches for students and podiums and rostrums for teachers. Each classroom has an Interactive Smart Board, LCD projector, and Head on mic. The wifi access in each class enables access to websites which helps in showing updates in real time. ICT enabled classrooms have helped in a more interactive, creative and updated teaching learning environment.

The college has an Audio-Visual Hall and one conference room which is used for seminars and workshops. Vishwabhavan (Auditorium) is air conditioned ICT enabled hall.

The college has two computer labs which are useful for computer based learning and training. Computer based exams are also conducted in the labs. All the computers in computer labs have various softwares installed such as SPSS, Tally etc. The language lab is used for soft skills and phonetics. The Psychology Lab is used by psychology students to conduct the experiments and administer the psychological tests on participants.

Library of the college contains numerous books and other e-resources accessible to students and faculty. There are two separate reading halls for students and teachers. The E-library aids in accessing multiple databases and e-resources.

In the year 2020-21, the college has meticulously implemented the strategic plan. Under curriculum design and development, the college has introduced an interdisciplinary approach in B. Com., along with new specialisation HRM for B.Com. and B.Com. Honours . The college also implemented value addition and skill development programmes through Liberal Arts and Skill Development Center. College has implemented six Quality mandates as prescribed by UGC. To cope up with challenges posed by the pandemic, training sessions were conducted for the teaching staff for online teaching and evaluation. The college has adopted an Outcome Based Learning approach and has therefore prepared Graduating Attributes, POs and PSOs. Evaluation Reforms of adopting 70-30 patterns were

The institute segregates solid waste into Bio-degradable and non-biodegradable. High-capacity biogas plant has been set up in the campus to deal with biodegradable waste. Institute manages biodegradable waste through green waste shredding machine and using the same to create vermicompost. Throughout the campus as well as outside the classroom dust bins are provided. Institution outsources waste management through our partners agency Sai Allied Services Limited.

Liquid Waste Management:

The institute takes care of liquid waste through well -constructed drainage system leading to the closed collection tanks, the tanks are regularly cleaned to avoid stagnation of water. Timely cleaning of tanks and drainage system is ensured.

E-Waste Management:

E-waste bins have been set up in the college campus to inculcate conscious behavior for segregation of E waste.

Water Recycling System:

Institute has a Rainwater Harvesting tank capacity of 10,00,000 liter and another water reuse is ensured through 30,000-liter capacity tank. The campus has borewells to meet general water needs of the institution. Soak pits were constructed at appropriate places to raise the water table. In nearby hill areas, storage tanks are built in collaboration with Pune based NGO Vasundhara.

The Academic year of 2020-21 was started in the last week of August 2020. The Regular and Backlog Examinations of UG and PG for October 2020 were held between 4th January to 4th February 2021. Open Book Examination pattern was used for these exams and exams were conducted using Google classrooms. College introduced 70-30 pattern to the first year students of BA and BCom. Accordingly, Internal Assessment of 70 Marks per subject was done by the subject teachers and 30 Marks Semester end examination was conducted. The regular semester end and backlog examinations of UG and PG for April 2021 were held from 8th May 2021. Online Open book examination format was used for these exams. And these exams were conducted using google classroom. Due to covid pandemic there was lockdown in Pune and college admin staff as well as teachers were working from home during the period of examinations. And, it was decided to conduct these online exams from Home. For this a detailed procedure and system incorporating all required checks and balances was devised. To explain all the details of the process, separate meetings/training sessions of UG & PG faculty, admin staff were conducted.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES**4.1 - Physical Facilities**

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning, viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipments, etc.

Each classroom has benches for students and podiums and rostrums for teachers. Each classroom has an Interactive Smart Board, LCD projector, and Head on mic. The wifi access in each class enables access to websites which helps in showing updates in real time. ICT enabled classrooms have helped in a more interactive, creative and updated teaching learning environment.

The college has an Audio-Visual Hall and one conference room which is used for seminars and workshops. Vishwabhavan (Auditorium) is air conditioned ICT enabled hall.

In the year 2020-21, the college has meticulously implemented the strategic plan. Under curriculum design and development, the college has introduced an interdisciplinary approach in B. Com., along with new specialisation HRM for B.Com. and B.Com. Honours . The college also implemented value addition and skill development programmes through Liberal Arts and Skill Development Center. College has implemented six Quality mandates as prescribed by UGC. To cope up with challenges posed by the pandemic, training sessions were conducted for the teaching staff for online teaching and evaluation. The College applies for various schemes introduced by UGC for getting funds for research & infrastructure. The college continued to spend the amount sanctioned under RUSA Component-8, 'Enhancing Quality and Research in Select Autonomous College' for the grant of Rs. 5 Crores. The College submits the Statement of Accounts along with utilization certificate as and when demanded by RUSA. The items are purchased as per the guidelines provided by Government of Maharashtra and the procedure is followed for the procurement of various items. Solid waste management:

The institute segregates solid waste into Bio-degradable and non-biodegradable. High-capacity biogas plant has been set up in the campus to deal with biodegradable waste. Institute manages biodegradable waste through green waste shredding machine and using the same to create vermicompost. Throughout the campus as well as outside the classroom dust bins are provided. Institution outsources waste management through our partners agency Sai Allied Services Limited.

Liquid Waste Management:

The institute takes care of liquid waste through well-constructed drainage system leading to the closed collection tanks, the tanks are regularly cleaned to avoid stagnation of water. Timely cleaning of tanks and drainage system is ensured.

E-Waste Management:

E-waste bins have been set up in the college campus to inculcate conscious behavior for segregation of E waste.

Water Recycling System:

Institute has a Rainwater Harvesting tank capacity of 10,00,000 liter and another water reuse is ensured through 30,000-liter capacity tank. The campus has borewells to meet general water needs of the institution. Soak pits were constructed at appropriate places to raise the water table. In nearby hill areas, storage tanks are built in collaboration with Pune based NGO Vasundhara.
