15.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The college has been a forerunner in transforming itself into a comprehensive, multidisciplinary learning institution thus aligning well with its vision and mission.

- In the year 2006 a dedicated Centre for Liberal Arts was introduced by the college which offers credit-based courses from different disciplines such as Language and Literature, Sciences, Performing Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences. The courses offered by the Centre focus on developing life skills and higher-order skills such as critical thinking, and creativity.
- In the year 2012, after being conferred with autonomous status, the college has been proactively introducing academic reforms and designing a contemporary curriculum with an interdisciplinary blend.
- In 2014, an embedded Honours program was introduced. In this programme courses offered by the Centre for Liberal Arts of our college have been integrated and the students choose and study two papers from a pool of interdisciplinary courses.
- In the year 2020-21, to further strengthen the interdisciplinary approach a new program (B.Com Integrated) was introduced, integrating courses offered by the Centre for Liberal Arts into the regular B.Com programme. In this programme students complete 12 interdisciplinary papers across the three-year degree programme along with the regular B. Com. papers.

The following International Professional Qualifications were integrated into B. Com. Programme to enhance employability and global mobility, thus providing students with an interdisciplinary, scientific and professional edge.

- 2013-14 - 'Association of Chartered Certified Accountants', UK (ACCA) was introduced.
- 2018-19 - ACCA programme was integrated as B. Com. in Accounting and Finance.
- 2020-21 - The specialization in Management Accounting, offered by The Chartered Institute of Management Accountants, UK (CIMA).
- 2022-23 - The specialization in Business Analytics offered by 'Institute of Analytics', UK.
- Understanding the employability and self-employability needs, in 2013 and 2015 the 'Centre for Innovation and Entrepreneurship' and 'Centre for Skill Development' were instituted respectively. The Centre for Innovation and Entrepreneurship has been promoting the spirit of Entrepreneurship among the students by conducting various activities, competitions, and workshops. Similarly, the Centre for Skill Development offers various skill-oriented courses to make students industry-ready.
- To encourage students to participate in sports, dance, music, fine arts, and other avenues such as internships, certificate courses, extension activities, and outreach programmes, additional credits are being offered from the year 2018-19.
- In the academic year 2023-24, as per the policy and guidelines received from the Government of Maharashtra on the implementation of the NEP, a four-year undergraduate degree program has been designed and implemented. Under this new structure, due care has been taken to incorporate a Multidisciplinary / Interdisciplinary approach into the curriculum.
- In the year 2018-19 to foster interdisciplinary research, the Centre for Study of Society (CSS) was established to encourage faculty to delve into relevant social issues.
- The college plans to convert the research work undertaken by students at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels into possible solution-based initiatives.

All these initiatives provide us with the confidence to explore the

opportunities offered by NEP 2020.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The National Education Policy was implemented in the state of Maharashtra from the academic year 2023-24, however, the students were encouraged to register for ABC from the academic year 2022-23.

- As per the UGC notification in the year 2021-22, the college registered itself on the portal of Academic Bank Credit. Since then the college has been proactively encouraging students to register for the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC).
- The registration process commenced in the academic year 2021-22 and to date(December 2023) 2107 students have successfully registered on the ABC portal.
- To ensure the smooth implementation of ABC, the institution has established a structured system where the examination department takes a lead role in its execution. This focused approach ensures that students are well-supported in their enrolment for the Academic Bank of Credits.
- The institution has also consistently prioritized collaboration and internationalization of education, with esteemed foreign institutions. With the introduction of the Academic Bank of Credits, the college plans to work towards recognizing credits earned by students participating in collaborating foreign universities.
- The college has also partnered with organizations like ISDC (International Skill Development Corporation) facilitating integrated programs with UK chartered bodies such as ACCA (Association of Chartered Certified Accountants), CIMA (Chartered Institute of Management Accountants), and IoA(Institute of Analytics).
- In our commitment to academic excellence, the college empowers faculty to design their curriculum and adopt innovative pedagogical approaches. The establishment of the Teaching Learning Resource Centre in 2018-19 emphasizes our dedication to encouraging faculty to pursue research and develop innovative pedagogy, teaching, and evaluation methods. The center has organized workshops and seminars on various topics including Academic writing and Publication in Scopus Journals, advanced online teaching tools, effective online quiz

administration, and the integration of technology in teaching. Faculty members are actively encouraged to participate in workshops and seminars addressing curriculum development, reflective and creative thinking, as well as contemporary teaching and learning methodologies. Over the past five years, 59 teachers have undergone Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) at various esteemed institutions.

The college proactively endeavors to implement various initiatives to help students and faculty members achieve academic excellence.

17.Skill development:

- The college emphasizes the holistic development of students by equipping them with higher-order skills. Employing a comprehensive approach to skill development, the institution aims to instill both professional and soft skills through various formal and informal initiatives:

a. A dedicated Centre for Skill Development was established in 2015 to provide expert-led skill-based courses that augment the necessary skills in the students. These meticulously designed courses have attracted a total enrolment of 1359 students from the academic year 2018-19 to 2022-23.

b. The college supports the acquisition of skills through avenues such as cultural activities, extension/outreach programs, internships, online courses, entrepreneurship, Liberal Arts, sports, and summer or winter schools and has a policy of giving credit to the students through the Value-Addition Credit Programme.

c. The Centre for Innovation and Entrepreneurship promotes the development of entrepreneurial skills through its various endeavors.

d. The Associations and Departments conduct various extracurricular and co-curricular activities to enable students to develop the needed skills such as leadership, negotiation, problem-solving, creative thinking, etc.

e The institution has also introduced industry-relevant and skill-based degree programmes such as B.Com and BA in Economics (Business

Analytics), as well as B.Com in Accounting and Finance and Management Accounting to instill professional skills.

f. The courses offered by the Centre for Liberal Arts are integrated into the Honours programme and the regular B.Com programme, thus providing opportunities for students to acquire skills such as critical and lateral thinking.

g. Courses like Business Computing are seamlessly integrated into the standard curriculum to equip students with basic technical skills.

h. Online collaborative courses are undertaken with international partnering universities to provide global exposure to the students.

- To provide the needed industry exposure, various experts and alumni are invited to conduct guest lectures and workshops. Similarly, alumni who are corporate professionals and some forging ahead as enterprising entrepreneurs are invited to participate in the Board of Studies.
- Aligned with the ethos of the institution, encapsulated in the motto 'Vasudeva Kutumbakam' (The World is One Family), the institution is committed to delivering value-based education. Topics that focus on fostering values are interwoven into the curriculum across all programs, including life skill courses in our Honors program. The curriculum addresses subjects such as ethics, sustainability, and responsible citizenship, reflecting our dedication to shaping ethically responsible individuals.
- In governance and day-to-day functioning, the college upholds ethical practices, transparency, and values. Initiatives such as the Centre for Human Excellence, National Service Scheme, and Symbiosis Social Involvement Program also promote the inculcation of civic-mindedness.

Through these efforts, the college helps students to develop a holistic personality.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The college takes pride in its Indian culture and ancient traditional knowledge and believes in the confluence of Indian

wisdom and western dynamism. The Centre for Liberal Arts of the college has been offering courses in Sanskrit, Mythology, Archaeology, etc. to introduce students to ancient Indian knowledge.

As per the policy and guidelines of and Maharashtra Government, NEP has been implemented from AY 2023-24. In the NEP structure, the component of the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) has been introduced as a special course in both B.Com and BA Degree programs. The different papers offered are

- 1) 'Indian Wisdom' with a focus on the ancient education system, Chanakya Niti, and Panchatantra
- 2) 'Hindi Bhasha Sanskriti and Savardharan' focusing on language and literature aspects of ancient India
- 3) 'Ancient Indian Geography' focusing on geography, heritage, and social life
- 4) 'Ancient Indian political system' focusing on political wisdom and practices.

Apart from this through extracurricular and co-curricular platforms such as Cultural Club, Marathi Drama Circle, Hindi Drama Circle, and NSS, Indian art, languages, and culture have been promoted by organizing various programmes.

The institution upholds the nationalistic spirit and fervor by celebrating Traditional Day, Bharatiya Bhasha Diwas, and Hindi Diwas every year. Indradhanu- the Art festival organized annually encourages students to showcase traditional and contemporary art forms.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The college envisions becoming a center of excellence in developing global competencies and focuses on student-centered learning.

- The college established a Learning Outcome Based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) in the academic year 2019-20 as per the UGC mandate.
- A committee was created for planning and implementing the Learning Outcome Based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) for adopting the OBE approach.

- A faculty development program (FDP) on Learning Outcome Based Curriculum and a full-day workshop was organized to train the teachers on framing and mapping Course Outcomes (COs), Program Outcomes(POs), and Program Specific Outcomes(PSOs).
- The Course Outcomes (CO) of 360 courses have been mapped with the respective POs and PSOs. The institution ensures that the syllabus is framed keeping the learning outcomes as the focal point.
- A similar approach was also adopted for designing assignments and framing question papers.

As the college aims to enhance the quality and relevance of education through the adoption of the OBE system it ensures that the outgoing students are well-equipped to meet the global challenges.

20.Distance education/online education:

Recognizing the importance of open and distance learning (ODL) mode, the college has established a media center with state-of-the-art infrastructure for designing and delivering online courses. Plans include offering degree programs in the ODL mode.

The college is proactive in the use of technology and provides the required technological support to enhance teaching and learning.

- The classes are equipped with interactive boards to enable teachers to use innovative ways of engaging students.
- For online assessments, there are 165 computers installed in a dedicated computer laboratory. The Internet is optimally used not just for accessing resources but also for collaborating with faculty and students from different parts of the world.
- Blended learning is encouraged through the adoption of Learning Management systems such as MS Teams and Google Classroom which are used for online assessments, assignment submissions, sharing curriculum content, and relevant study material.

1.1.1 Curricula developed and implemented have relevance to the local, national, regional and global developmental needs which is reflected in Programme outcomes (POs), Programme Specific Outcomes(PSOs) and Course Outcomes(COs) of the Programmes offered by the Institution.

The endeavour of the college has always been to add value to the curriculum by designing and developing the courses according to the changing trends of the ecosystem. The college aims at fulfilling its vision of being a 'Centre of Excellence' by developing global

competencies through knowledge creation, dissemination, character building and social commitment. For the Academic year 2022-23, a total of 30 programmes and 360 Courses have been offered by the college.

The Programme Outcomes and Programme Specific Outcomes have been distinctly defined, and for each course, the course outcomes have been systematically aligned with them using the Revised Bloom's Taxonomy.

Out of the total 360 courses, 209 courses address local needs, 237 courses address regional needs, 304 courses address national needs and 341 courses address global needs.

To cite a few examples- In a course titled, Dalit Literature in English Translation it has texts written by Dalit writers from Maharashtra as well as the other parts of India. Similarly, courses like Advanced Financial Accounting and Advanced International Financial Management offered to ACCA students focus a lot on understanding the application of International Accounting Standards (IFRS) thus addressing the global needs.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses students' learning levels and organises special programmes for both slow and advanced learners.

The college assesses the learning levels based on the student's performance in the October exams. The class average for each degree program is calculated using these results. Students who fail in the October exams are categorized as slow learners.

Subject teachers provide individual guidance and additional sessions as needed to help these students cope up with regular classroom instruction. The Centre for Skill Development (CSD) offers specific courses like 'Effective Communication Skills' and 'Universal Human Values' designed particularly for slow learners. These students also have the option to enroll in other courses provided by CSD.

The college offers a variety of programs and courses to accommodate the diverse learning abilities of advanced learners. These include:

- Honours Degree program
- B.Com program with a specialization in Management Accounting recognized by the Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA, UK)
- B.Com with Business Analytics
- Numerous certificate courses and diplomas offered by the Centre for Liberal Arts, focusing on holistic student development
- A range of courses provided by the Center for Skill Development to enhance and refine high-level skills.
- Project Campus Entrepreneur is a 3- credit based Incubation Program to give an opportunity for budding entrepreneurs.

The Academic Calendar Committee (ACC) prepares the Academic Calendar in collaboration with the Principal, Vice Principal, IQAC, Controller of Examination, Heads of departments, Centers, Association in charge, and Teachers of Symbiosis College of Arts and Commerce. It first finalises the dates that mark the beginning and end of the two semesters. In accordance with these dates, examination dates are finalised and communicated to students. Dates are further scheduled for statutory meetings and remaining slots are earmarked by prioritising mandatory programs, curricular, and cocurricular events. Finalised calendar is uploaded on college website for the reference of all stakeholders and fulfilment in accordance is sought.

Teaching plans are prepared by the subject teachers within the respective departments at the beginning of each academic year in accordance with the planned syllabus. The topics are designed along a week-wise format (13 weeks for undergraduate courses, 15 weeks for graduate courses), allocating the topics, supplementary case studies and assignments. Consultation of heads of departments is sought to ensure an ideal distribution of teaching time and resources. Completion of syllabus and adherence to the teaching plan is

evaluated as a part of the evaluative deliberations undertaken during departmental meetings at the close of the year.

Symbiosis College of Arts and Commerce is committed to create a strong research culture amongst its faculty and students. The college has set-up a Research and Development Cell (as per the UGC Circular F.No.1-5/2021 (NEP/DESK-PARL) previously known as RAC (Research Advisory Committee, est. Sept. 2018), which has been instrumental in monitoring the research culture and activities of the college. The committee operates under the chairmanship of the Principal, Dr. Hrishikesh Soman.

The College has developed a research fund, which provides monetary assistance to faculty members for various publications in journals and paper presentations in seminars and conferences. The College has institutionalized the 'Code of Ethics' since 2022 and formed an Ethics Committee that upholds the principles of ethical research conduct and ensures integrity of scholarly inquiry. In the year 2022, the college purchased the Turnitin software for plagiarism checking and verification of research reports and articles.

A strong IT support system along with well-equipped library and laboratory set-up is available for research purposes. The college library has access to many online resources as well as journals such as CMIE data, JSTOR, Oxford University Press, among others.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) plays an instrumental role in designing, implementing and institutionalizing quality initiatives in the college. IQAC regularly conducts meetings to review teaching, learning processes and actions are initiated based on the recommendations.

IQAC has devised and strengthened the System for conducting activities in college. Earlier the departments/clubs organizing the activities would prepare a budget and conduct the activity. However, since the college has adopted Learning Outcome based Curricular Framework (LOCF), it was necessary to streamline the process of planning and executing the activities.

The steps followed in the new system are as follows:

1. Preparation of proposal by concerned department/association/club head
2. Verification and approval by IQAC
3. Submission of proposal to purchase department for procurement planning of resources required for the activity.
4. Submission of proposal to accounts department for budgetary allocation.
5. Approval by Principal
6. Submission of proposal to central finance department of the parent body and obtaining approval.
7. Conduct the activity adhering to the approved proposal.
8. Post activity payment clearance to guest speakers/judges/experts, vendors.
9. Submission of activity completion report in the format prescribed by IQAC.

This system ensured a detailed planning and reporting mechanism ensuring an alignment with CO's and PO's.

7.1.1 - Measures initiated by the Institution for the promotion of gender equity during the year

The College is committed to promoting gender equity by fostering an inclusive and supportive atmosphere for women on campus. The premises are monitored 24/7 by CCTV cameras, complemented by a skilled security team ensuring thorough oversight. Additionally, the college offers the support of a full-time female counselor who is available to assist both students and faculty. Counseling sessions are conducted through diverse channels, including tele-counseling, video calls, and in-person meetings.

Under Project Veera, students have conducted noteworthy programs that address gender issues such as 'Lecture on Menstrual Health and Hygiene', online interactive session on 'Stigma Around Men's Mental Health', fundraising campaigns for Sanitary pad distribution, and raising awareness about health problems caused by iron deficiency and poor nutrition.

Appropriate amenities such as clean restrooms and common rooms are spaces available for women on campus. Each ladies washroom on the campus is equipped with Padcare bins to ensure the separate and secure disposal of sanitary pads. Additionally, the campus features dedicated washroom facilities that are Divyangjan-friendly for both male and female individuals. In the academic year 2022-23, the college conducted a gender audit to assess the effectiveness of its initiatives and measures in promoting gender equity within the

institution.

The college prioritizes a clean and hygienic environment by implementing comprehensive waste management practices. In accordance with Pune Municipal Corporation norms, solid waste is meticulously segregated into dry and wet categories. Housekeeping services, under an agreement with Sai Services Limited, ensure vigilant waste maintenance. Single-use plastic is strictly prohibited on campus, aligning with UGC norms, and alternatives are adopted. Sanitary facilities are regularly cleaned, and separate waste bins are strategically placed throughout the campus.

The college fosters awareness about waste identification and associated hazards through NSS programs and workshops. Environmental awareness courses and projects on waste management are integrated into the curriculum. Wet waste from the mess is converted into biogas, promoting effective management. Garden waste undergoes composting for use as fertilizer. Initiatives such as guest lectures, cleanliness drives, and river cleaning projects engage students and staff in environmental causes.

Liquid waste is managed through regular maintenance and drainage into PMC systems. E-waste is handled according to a dedicated IT policy, either donated to NGOs and schools or supplied to authorized disposal agencies. For hazardous E-waste management Standard Operating Procedure is followed. Students creatively upcycle non-biodegradable waste for decoration during events, promoting sustainability in various college programs.

For the Academic year 2022-23, a total of 30 programmes and 360 Courses have been offered by the college.

The Academic Calendar Committee (ACC) prepares the Academic Calendar in collaboration with the Principal, Vice Principal, IQAC, Controller of Examination, Heads of departments, Centers, Association in charge, and Teachers of Symbiosis College of Arts and Commerce. Online MCQ Examinations were conducted in the months of November and December 2022 for Semester 1,3 and 5 and in March 2023 for Semester 2,4 and 6. Internal assessment 1 for both semesters was conducted using Microsoft Teams.

The Regular and Backlog Examinations of Semester 1,3 and 5, and Backlog examinations of semester 2,4 and 6 of UG were held between 22nd November 2022 to 23rd December 2022 and for PG were

held between 13th December 2023 to 23rd December 2022. In 26 average days the results of these examinations were declared. The Regular and backlog examinations of Semester 2,4 and 6 and Backlog examinations of Semester 1,3 and 5 of UG were conducted between 12th April 2023 to 8th May 2023 and for PG were conducted between 26th April 2023 to 9th May 2023. These all examinations were conducted offline in the college campus. In 30 average days the results of these examinations were declared.

Internal mark list has been modified to incorporate COs considered by the faculty in the Internal Assessment. The Internal Assessment schedule was shared with the faculties at the beginning of each semester.

Symbiosis College of Arts and Commerce is committed to create a strong research culture amongst its faculty and students. The college has set-up a Research and Development Cell (as per the UGC Circular F.No.1-5/2021 (NEP/DESK-PARL) previously known as RAC (Research Advisory Committee, est. Sept. 2018), which has been instrumental in monitoring the research culture and activities of the college. The committee operates under the chairmanship of the Principal, Dr. Hrishikesh Soman.

The College has developed a research fund, which provides monetary assistance to faculty members for various publications in journals and paper presentations in seminars and conferences. The College has institutionalized the 'Code of Ethics' since 2022 and formed an Ethics Committee that upholds the principles of ethical research conduct and ensures integrity of scholarly inquiry. In the year 2022, the college purchased the Turnitin software for plagiarism checking and verification of research reports and articles.

A strong IT support system along with well-equipped library and

laboratory set-up is available for research purposes. The college library has access to many online resources as well as journals such as CMIE data, JSTOR, Oxford University Press, among others.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) plays an instrumental role in designing, implementing and institutionalizing quality initiatives in the college. IQAC regularly conducts meetings to review teaching, learning processes and actions are initiated based on the recommendations.

5. Approval by Principal
6. Submission of proposal to central finance department of the parent body and obtaining approval.
7. Conduct the activity adhering to the approved proposal.
8. Post activity payment clearance to guest speakers/judges/experts, vendors.
9. Submission of activity completion report in the format

prescribed by IQAC.

The College is committed to promoting gender equity by fostering an inclusive and supportive atmosphere for women on campus. The premises are monitored 24/7 by CCTV cameras, complemented by a skilled security team ensuring thorough oversight. Additionally, the college offers the support of a full-time female counselor

who is available to assist both students and faculty. Counseling sessions are conducted through diverse channels, including tele-counseling, video calls, and in-person meetings.

Under Project Veera, students have conducted noteworthy programs that address gender issues such as 'Lecture on Menstrual Health and Hygiene', online interactive session on 'Stigma Around Men's Mental Health', fundraising campaigns for Sanitary pad distribution, and raising awareness about health problems caused by iron deficiency and poor nutrition.

Appropriate amenities such as clean restrooms and common rooms are spaces available for women on campus. Each ladies washroom on the campus is equipped with Padcare bins to ensure the separate and secure disposal of sanitary pads. Additionally, the campus features dedicated washroom facilities that are Divyangjan-friendly for both male and female individuals. In the academic year 2022-23, the college conducted a gender audit to assess the effectiveness of its initiatives and measures in promoting gender equity within the institution.

The college prioritizes a clean and hygienic environment by implementing comprehensive waste management practices. In accordance with Pune Municipal Corporation norms, solid waste is meticulously segregated into dry and wet categories. Housekeeping services, under an agreement with Sai Services Limited, ensure vigilant waste maintenance. Single-use plastic is strictly prohibited on campus, aligning with UGC norms, and alternatives are adopted. Sanitary facilities are regularly cleaned, and separate waste bins are strategically placed throughout the campus.

The college fosters awareness about waste identification and associated hazards through NSS programs and workshops. Environmental awareness courses and projects on waste management are integrated into the curriculum. Wet waste from the mess is converted into biogas, promoting effective management. Garden waste undergoes composting for use as fertilizer. Initiatives such as guest lectures, cleanliness drives, and river cleaning projects engage students and staff in environmental causes.

Liquid waste is managed through regular maintenance and drainage into PMC systems. E-waste is handled according to a dedicated IT policy, either donated to NGOs and schools or supplied to authorized disposal agencies. For hazardous E-waste management Standard Operating Procedure is followed. Students creatively upcycle non-biodegradable waste for decoration during events, promoting sustainability in various college programs.
